Pupils from a variety of local primary schools who meet this criteria visit The Wave , Bristol for the day to take part in a 'Beginners' surf session. Giving them the opportunity to experience something new collectively and meet prospective peers in the process to help ease anxiety about the transition to KS3.	£218.67	Surfing to High School provided children with the opportunity to take part in a new activity and boosted their confidence when meeting new people.
